College Board Big Future <https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/>

This site offers a college search and a wealth of other information about the whole college application process.

Princeton Review www.princetonreview.com

Students gain insights into perceptions of the academic and social traits of the 371 “best” colleges and universities through the rankings published each year on this site as well as other information.

Peterson’s College Search www.Petersons.com

One feature this search has is offering up a list of other schools you might like that are similar to one you’ve already chosen.

Common Application www.commonapp.org

Under the *Advanced Search* tab, you can do some searching for colleges, but this is an invaluable resource for students applying to the over 450 colleges and universities that have agreed to fully accept the Common Application as equal to their own institutional application for admission. Since UNH, Keene and Plymouth now use the Common Application, many Coe-Brown students have found that using this form enables them to fill out one application that is accepted at three to five or more of their colleges.

The Common Application is now linked with Naviance where the teachers upload their reference and counselors file the school forms. We will be having some training sessions this fall on how to use this program in conjunction with Common Application. As always, see your counselor if you have questions. *Make sure to check the Supplemental Forms area for each school so that all forms are completed!*

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There are also several sites which serve niches of the college search which might be of interest to students and families.
